ORDINANCE 1994-55

An Ordinance of the Town of Rolling Hills Adopting W.S. §31-5-704 Within the Town; Prohibiting the Operation of Motor Vehicles on Designated Bike Paths; Prohibiting Riding Horses on Bike Paths; and, Providing Penalties for the Violation Hereof

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF ROLLING HILLS:

Section 1 – Riding on Designated Bike Paths

Whenever a usable path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway, bicycle riders shall use the path and shall not use the roadway. There shall be no bicycle traffic on 55 Ranch Road within the limits of the Town.

Section 2 – Operating Motor Vehicles on Bike Paths

No person or persons shall operate any motor vehicle on any bicycle path within the town. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the operation of any motor vehicle on streets within Rolling Hills that bisect any bicycle path. Nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the operation of repair or maintenance vehicles on the bike path so long as said vehicles are operated by employees, agents, or authorized contractors of the Town.

Section 3 – Livestock on Bicycle Paths

No person shall lead, ride or drive any livestock, including but not limited to, cows, sheep or horses on any bicycle path within the town.

Section 4 – Traffic Control on Bicycle Paths

All persons using a bicycle path within the town shall obey all traffic control and regulatory signs posted on or near said bicycle path.

Section 5 – Definitions

All definitions of words and terms used herein shall be consistent with the definitions of Chapter 31 of the Wyoming State Statutes.

Section 6 – Severability

If for any reason any part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is found to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 7 – Penalties

Any person who violates any portion of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in an amount not to exceed \$750.
