With a population of just under 500, Rolling Hills provides a small community with a country atmosphere. Relax on your deck while watching the horses graze, or muse while the deer and the antelope play.

A short jaunt away, residents can enjoy fishing the North Platte River, peaking the sand dunes, foraging through the mountains, and boating at a nearby lake.

Located in the central portion of Wyoming, Rolling Hills is approximately 30 miles east of Casper and 4 miles north of Glenrock.

Local Recreation

Rolling Hills is home to a large, grassy park hosting a shelter, basketball court, Neos and playground equipment. Rolling Hills also maintains a bike path / walkway that stretches around the south side of the town, and a bridle path for the horses. The sand dunes recreational area is just north of Rolling Hills, while the Platte River is right down the hill. The nearby town of Glenrock offers a multitude of recreation including a golf course and a rec center.
